50. Wurmlingen (Baden-Württemberg, Germany). In the Württembergisches Landesmuseum, Stuttgart. An iron spearhead, dated around 600 or a little later. Ornaments and runes were inlaid with silver. The runic part is preceded by a sign with unknown meaning: \(\lambda\). It recalls Hachmann's "Sarmatische Heilszeichen" (Hachmann 1993), or of one of the Anglo-Saxon beonna coins, which display a sign \(\forall\), meaning 'rex'. The initial sign of the Wurmlingen inscription is followed by a word-divider, and the runes :dorih, which may be (part of) a PN nsm. a-stem Dorih, possibly second part of a PN like Theodorich.
